What we've been up to . . .

- In 7th grade—Last week, students had a chance to retake their first quarter spelling quizzes. These updated grades are reflected in their final first quarter grade. Students also began a grammar unit on capitalization and punctuation. We have continued this unit this week and today in class, discussed the importance of punctuation by editing a "Dear John" letter. Funny how much a few punctuation marks can change the meaning of writing!
- In 8th grade—Last week, we reviewed some test-taking strategies to hopefully use not only on the WKCE test, but any test in any class. This week, as a result of WKCE testing, I met with my 8th graders only three days. On Wednesday and Friday we did a puzzle activity to outline the writing process. Ask your 8th grader if they could describe to you how putting puzzles together is a lot like organizing an essay. Next week, we'll be working on writing a personal narrative. We'll be in the computer lab a couple days and students will have the opportunity to revise and edit their essays with a partner.
- Looking ahead . . . on Thursday, November 15, both my 7th graders and my 8th graders will have classroom guidance. Seventh graders will have a lesson discussing cyberbullying and online/technology safety. 8th graders will have a presentation on healthy vs. unhealthy relationships. These topics, too, are great conversation starters and certainly very timely topics.
