Accomplishments

- Neenah High School exceeded expectations on the Wisconsin state report card in 2013-14 for the third straight year. The school's score of 76.0 was its highest in the three years of state report card data.
- Science teacher Scott Hertting was one of two Wisconsin teachers in 2015 to receive the prestigious Presidential Award for Excellence in Mathematics and Science Teaching.
- Students from Neenah High School organized a group representing seven local high schools to build a Habitat for Humanity Home in 2014.
- Neenah High School received the 2013-14 Wisconsin Spirit of Excellence Award, which is awarded to one school for overall school spirit, leadership, sportsmanship and community service.

Neenah High School is proudly positioned in the heart of the Fox River Valley in East Central Wisconsin. With an enrollment of 1,977 students and a dedicated teaching and counseling staff of 128 with a support staff of 55, Neenah continues to be a frontrunner in many areas, including academics, athletics and the arts. The school calendar consists of two semesters, each 18 weeks in length. Neenah High School is accredited by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction.



Programs

- Diversified curriculum to meet needs of students of all abilities. Course selections include standard and advanced classes. Alternative programs are available on campus and in the community.
- Numerous courses available for college credit through local or neighboring colleges and universities.
- Optional academies offered that provide comprehensive education toward a specific career field in Business and Information Technology, Health Careers, Hospitality and Culinary Arts, Manufacturing and Engineering and Visual Arts.
- Freshman Seminar program assists with transition to high school and requires community service projects
- All students in grades 6-12 provided their own personal Chromebook
- Over 50 clubs and activities, including highly-successful varsity athletics, drama and music programs

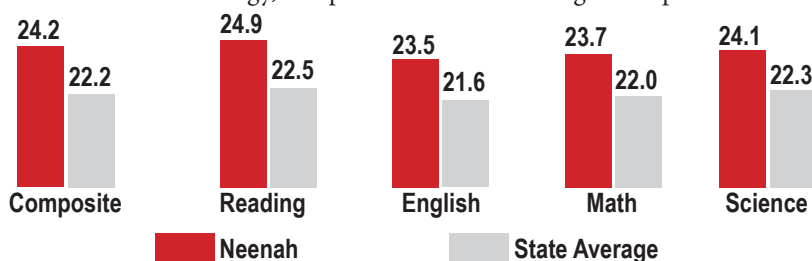

ACT Profile

Neenah graduates posted a **24.2 composite ACT score in 2015**. The score was significantly better than the state average of 22.2 and the national average of 21.0. Neenah students had scored a 24.1 on the test each of the past three years and again ranked as the highest-performing public school district in the Fox Valley area.

For the second straight year, Neenah had 48 percent of its students meet the ACT benchmark for college readiness in English composition, algebra, social science and biology, compared to the state average of 35 percent.

Neenah High School graduates were accepted at nearly all University of Wisconsin System 4-year colleges and at numerous private and technical colleges throughout Wisconsin.

Several students also were accepted at out-of-state colleges such as: Arizona State University, Drake University, Fordham University, Iowa State University, Michigan Technological University, University of St. Thomas, University of Kansas, Swarthmore College, Texas A&M University, University of Illinois, University of Michigan, University of Minnesota, University of Oklahoma, University of Oregon and College of William and Mary.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

The College Board's Advanced Placement Program provides academically prepared students the opportunity to take rigorous college-level courses while still in high school and to earn college credit, advanced placement or both for successful performance on the AP exams. Overall, Neenah offers 18 College Board authorized classes. In 2014-15, a total of 285 students took 465 AP exams.

Neenah had 77 students honored for exceptional achievement on AP exams in 2014-15, including four students who qualified for the National AP Scholar Award with an average score of 4 or higher on a five-point scale on at least eight AP exams. Neenah had 31 students qualify for the AP Scholar with Distinction Award by posting scores of 3 or higher on five or more exams. Another 20 students qualified for the AP Scholar with Honor Award by earning an average score of at least 3.25 on all AP exams taken and earning scores of 3 or higher on four or more exams. Another 26 students qualified for the AP Scholar Award by completing three or more AP exams with scores of 3 or higher.
