

Three Wisconsin Association of School Boards (WASB) resolutions were supported and parliamentary procedures were discussed at the September 5 meeting of the Neenah Joint School District Board of Education.

The resolutions showed the District's support for items that WASB will push for statewide legislation. The resolutions were in the areas of improving systems to reduce seclusion and restraints, revising the Wisconsin Improvement Program for incentivizing talent development and compensating Wisconsin post-secondary student teacher supervisors.

The Board also held a discussion to review parliamentary procedures and ensure that all Board members understand the meeting process.
