#### **Elementary Summer Reading Academy:**

The purpose of summer reading academy is to provide reading instruction for students entering grades one through five whose reading achievement scores are below grade level, or for students that need to solidify additional reading skills.

Students entering grades 1 and 2 are eligible if their reading achievement scores are one-half year or more below grade level.

Students entering grades 3-5 are eligible if their reading achievement scores are one year or more below grade level.

Each class period will be ninety minutes per day.

#### **Elementary Summer Math Academy:**

The purpose of summer math academy is to provide mathematics instruction to students entering grades one through five whose math achievement scores are below grade level, or for students who need to solidify additional grade level math skills. Students are eligible if they are six months or more below grade level, or if they continue to score below expectations on the math area of their report card.

Each class period will be ninety minutes per day.

#### **Kindergarten Readiness:**

The purpose of kindergarten readiness is to provide extra skill development for pre-kindergarten children before they enter a formal group-learning environment.

Each class period will be three hours in length.
