

ONE PASSED REFERENDUM WILL:



Impact all students
at every school in the
District within four years



Increase the mill rate by \$.99 (\$99 per \$100,000 of fair market property value), bringing the projected mill rate to \$7.84 – **lower than it was four years ago**





Fulfill more than 75% of the facilities projects in the District's long-range plan.

The remaining portion of the long-range plan can be funded through the operational budget, **WITHOUT ANOTHER REFERENDUM**

The District hasn't passed a facilities referendum in 25 YEARS (1995)



The average age of school buildings in the District is more than **70 YEARS OLD**



Because INTEREST RATES have fallen to 40-YEAR LOWS
