Accomplishments

- Opened a new high school in the fall of 2023 following a successful \$114.9 million referendum in April 2020. The school consists of unique, flexible learning spaces with elective courses positioned in the high-traffic areas of the school.
- Exceeded expectations on the Wisconsin state report card in 2022-23 with a score of 72.9. The student achievement score of 70.3 was the same or higher than 82.1% of the 9-12 schools in the state.
- Offers a unique project-based learning curriculum called "Fusion Academy" for about 100 freshmen and sophomores.
- Offers an entrepreneurial IncubatorEDU and AcceleratorEDU class where students create and pitch a project to investors.
- Has a graduation rate of 95.7%, which is higher than the state average of 91.8%.
- Requires graduating seniors to earn college credit, beginning in 2022-23.

Neenah High School is proudly positioned in the heart of the Fox River Valley in East Central Wisconsin. With an enrollment of 1,977 students and a dedicated teaching and counseling staff of 135 with a support staff of 55, Neenah continues to be a frontrunner in many areas, including academics, athletics and the arts. The school calendar consists of two semesters, each 18 weeks in length. Neenah High School is accredited by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction.




Programs

ACT Profile

The 2023 Neenah High School graduating class posted a **20.6 composite ACT score**. The score was higher than the state average of 19.2 and Neenah students outperformed state averages in each content area. Neenah's scores have annually ranked the highest among public school districts in the Fox Valley area.

Neenah's students were above the state averages in college readiness in each content area as well.

Neenah Joint School District Proficiency Scale

Students receive ongoing feedback related to or connected to each learning target throughout the duration of the course. In addition, students' future readiness is measured in the areas of respect, responsibility and curiosity using the same grading metric as the academic grade.

For each learning target, students will receive feedback using a three-level scale.

Proficient means that the student demonstrates and applies a comprehensive understanding of the learning target at that point in the school year. Developing means that the student demonstrates and/or applies a partial understanding of the learning target at that point in the school year. Beginning means that the student demonstrates minimal understanding of the learning target at that point in the school year.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT®

The College Board's Advanced Placement Program provides academically prepared students the opportunity to take rigorous college-level courses while still in high school and to earn college credit, advanced placement or both for successful performance on the AP exams.

Overall, Neenah offers 22 College Board authorized classes. In 2022-23, a total of 353 students took 508 AP exams in 24 subjects with an average score of 3.5

Neenah had 70 students honored for exceptional achievement on AP exams in 2022-23.
